When he travels, he visits as many Rotary Clubs as possible to keep that connection. His family just moved to Ottawa as his wife was appointed as Jordan's new Ambassador to Canada. He is originally from Vancouver.

Classification talk: Gord Leverton – Commercial banking: President Marcia introduction:

Gord joined Rotary in 2001 and joined RCWO in 2020. He has quickly involved himself in the Club. He Co-chairs our Rotary Foundation Committee and arrives early at the weekly meetings so he is usually helping with the set-up. And for members who cannot be there to do their set-up duties, he offered to do it for them if they donate \$25 to our Rotary Foundation!

Background:

Gord was born in Picton Ontario, went to school there and enjoyed scouting so much in his youth, especially winter camping, that scouting became a lifelong passion. He pursued a rewarding career in banking and entertained us with his many adventures as he moved to different branches in Ontario, not only honing his skills in accounts and lending, but also connecting with the people who worked in these communities.

Career:

His first job was with the Bank of Montreal in Kingston. New staff were rotated through positions learning every task in the branch from teller to accounts. This comprehensive training gave him invaluable skills that helped shape his career. He was approached for many advancement opportunities and even switched to a position at the Royal Bank at their downtown Toronto branch. His career brought him to many communities across Ontario, and he enjoyed getting to know his new job and staying involved with scouting in these communities But it was his transfer to the Niagara region that he described as the highlight of his career. His family spent many enjoyable years in St Catharines.

Rotary:

In 2001, **Gord** was introduced to Rotary when his manager asked staff to get involved in service clubs. He was hooked from the very first meeting! He felt like he had found his tribe, that this is where he wanted to be. He singled out 2009-2010 Rotary year, his Presidential year, as his best year in Rotary. He participated in the Rotary Leadership Institute course and then went on to be a facilitator for that course. He went to the Montreal International Convention and also volunteered at the Toronto meeting at the Friendship House. He had so much fun that year and since 2020, when he moved to Ottawa, and he is grateful for the fellowship and friendship that Rotary has brought into his life.

Conclusion:

In his own words, he had a great career. He enjoyed negotiating with the bank and the clients to find some common ground so they could lend them the money they needed for their project. That was the fun part of the job! It was never a routine job. His humour and wonderful stories shed a heartwarming insight into the life of a banker. His parting words: "hope you treat your banker a little better"!

Q&A

In answer to **Larry Chop**, his move to Ottawa in 2020 was precipitated by his wife's failing health - his son lives in Ottawa and shares with her care.

President Marcia thanked **Gord** for his inspirational talk about his passion for his career in banking and his dedication to Rotary.
