Classification Talk ;Ana Ideias

President Marcia introduced **Ana** saying she had been a member since January, worked on two Club committees and is a keen photographer (one of her pictures is in the Cash Calendar). **Ana** would tell us about herself,

including her classification- Residential Real Estate for Seniors.

Ana took the mic and told of her journey from childhood in Portugal to her career as a specialist in residential seniors' real estate. A keen photographer and active volunteer, **Ana** prioritizes giving back and pursues two life goals: making her children proud and leaving the world a bit better

She lost her mother at age four and was adopted by her aunt and uncle who brought her to Canada. She shared amusing anecdotes of her adjusting to a new culture- as her discovery of Halloween and learning English words while avoiding the use of Portuguese words which sound impolite to anglophone ears.

Ana is the mother of two grown children amicably coparented with her exhusband. She is recently remarried.

Ana's career path has been diverse—spanning roles as a conference planner, for Nortel ESL teacher, personal trainer, and, for the past 13 years, a real estate agent.

She specializes in helping seniors navigate the complexities of downsizing and moving. Her approach focuses on empathy, patience, and providing comprehensive support, from coordinating estate sales to helping clients determine what to keep, sell, or donate. **Ana** shared strategies for easing this transition, such as taking photos of sentimental items and engaging trusted professionals. Her deep connection to seniors stems from her upbringing with her grandparents, shaping her understanding of the challenges older adults face.

Her focus on giving back led her to join Rotary, the Ottawa Women's Canadian Club, the Ottawa Council on Aging and. to volunteer for #AbleTo which pairs volunteers with adults who have learning or physical challenges. She loves to travel and to be outdoors. Her happy place is anywhere with her camera in her hand

Ana concluded by emphasizing the importance of building relationships and giving back, echoing her favorite quote: "We make a living by what we get, but we make a life by what we give."
