He served as a club secretary from 2002 to 2004. He was also instrumental in designing our club's 50th & 60Th Anniversary books. He was technical support and History committee contributor.

Using his experience in writing grants, he helped and continues to help Bea Osome in writing grants for her water wells projects in Kenya.

Jim chaired the International Service Committee on several occasions. He was the treasurer for the committee as he kept a close eye on how the funds were disbursed and ensured their accuracy in many currencies.

In 1999 Jim received a PHF from the club, he was also the recipient of the Avenues of Service Award. Jim is a PHF + 8. In 2007 he received the Avenues of Service Citation, an award that recognizes outstanding efforts of a member in each of the Four Avenues of Service.

Another fact I would like to share about Jim, for those who don't know. He is the grandfather of over 100 children at an orphanage, which his son James and his wife Janene manage and run in the kingdom of Eswatini (Formerly Swaziland)
