#### **MEETING BEGINS**

### **PRESENTATION**

**Mike Traub** introduced his brother-in-law, Ian McConnachie, a dentist with a history of volunteer humanitarian service in central America and the Caribbean for over 10 years.

McConnachie spoke to his four projects in Haiti after the devastating earthquake of 2010. His first visit was to Cap Haitien, where US and Canadian NGOs had set up hospitals and an orphanage. Access to electricity, transportation infrastructure, and technicians was very limited. Visits followed in 2013, 2015 and 2017. He was able go beyond basic pain relief to more sophisticated restorative procedures. He also spoke of the endemic violence in the area, and of the humanity of local volunteers who provided translation services and of the loan by a construction company of a powerful generator provide electricity for the clinic to function on a daily basis. His accompanying photographs were of everyday life in street markets, of colourful local buses and of motorcycles which were daily transport for children going to school. The parents pay for the schools and parents take pride in dressing their children properly for school. Compelling was a photo of a giant tractor positioning the generator. Gave Moffett thanked Ian and presented him with a memento and said that RCWO would mark his presentation with a donation to End Polio Now. President Pardeep told us that he had worked in Haiti with CIDA before the earthquake and that problems were serious even then
