# ROTARY VISITORS DAY

There was a definite "buzz" in the room with what had to have been well over 100 Rotarians and their guests present. Interact students and their two teachers from Woodroffe High School had come early to help set up the ShelterBox tent in the outside hallway.

At 1200 **President Jean Bégin** invited us to go to the buffet. At 1220 she rang the bell and welcomed everyone to the 36th meeting of the Rotary Year with a special welcome to all the visitors who had joined us today. She hoped that their attendance would spark their interest in joining our club. She then asked us to rise and sing O Canada accompanied by **Rod Holmes** on the key board. **Ron Scott** then said a thoughtful, classic Rotarian grace.

**Ken Murray** then recognized this week's guests who included Area Governor Fay Campbell and visiting Rotarians from Red Deer Lolita and Hans Wiesner. **Ken** gave a special mention to the Woodroffe Interact Club members and their teachers and then asked all the other visitors and guests to stand. We sang them our traditional Welcome song and they applauded us.

Joan Heyland's Past President Draw had two prizes- an Indigo gift card from Joan won by Linda Flynn, and a hat and T-shirt donated by Cindy Wheeler, the Director of Development at the Rotary Home. Larry Chop won these happily adding to his baseball hat collection.

For this week's Website trivia contest **Linda Flynn** told us the challenge and the answer. From the basket of correct entries last week's winner, **Marilyn Letts**, drew the name of **President Jean** who thus won six homemade butter tarts. Mmmmm, good!

Graeme Fraser, Chairperson of the Membership Committee, took the microphone to tell our guests about our Club. Graeme began by thanking Merv Letts and Ken Murray for pulling together this successful Rotary Visitors Day. He then thanked the Club committees and outside groups for setting up the displays and encouraged us to visit them. At our tables were one-page collations prepared by

Rod Holmes of summaries from some of the committees of what had happened at their meetings the previous week.

Graeme explained there are three types of membership: Regular for a single person; Corporate where a business can join and have up to 4 people active in the Club; Associate for an individual to participate in specific Club activities. Graeme opined "joining Rotary will change your life."

**Graeme** then told about our fundraising: the golf tournament, the Cash Calendar, Mums for Thanksgiving and Music for Humanity. Run by Club members and partners they provide the money for local and international projects. Locally we support the Ottawa Rotary Home, a respite home for children and families; the Dave Smith Treatment Centre for Adolescents; camperships for deserving children; wheelchairs for needy persons; Dictionary 4 Life which promotes literacy by giving dictionaries to Grade three children in beacon schools; the Interact Club at Woodroffe High School. Internationally we support Rotary peace and development studies in Thailand; club members have built a school and medical clinic in a large Nairobi slum and caused over nine wells to be drilled in rural Kenyan schools. Proceeds of our Music for Humanity concert April 7 for End Polio Now will be matched 2:1 by the Bill and Belinda Gates Foundation.

Pardeep Ahluwalia, President Elect and outgoing chair of the Cash Calendar project, thanked the businesses for buying ads which covers production costs. Calendar sales dollars can thus all go to local community support. 2018 Calendar sales exceeded the previous best in 2014 and Club partners, particularly Kemptville RC contributed well over half the total.

Caroline De Witt told of her experience as a new Club member. She joined our club in 2017 for the fellowship and to give back by participating in Club services. She had found our members welcoming, professional and friendly and encouraged guests to consider joining us.

Then came the exciting part of the meeting. **President Jean** presented to John Lark, chair of the Rotary Home Foundation and Cindy Wheeler, Director of Development at the Rotary Home, a cheque for \$10,000.00. John Lark thanked the club members saying there wouldn't be a Rotary Home if it weren't for the Rotary Club of West Ottawa.

Tickets were available at the meeting, all week from Jen's office, at the door or through Eventbrite.
