Visit of District Governor Nabil Oudeh

It was a cool grey day outside and the forecast had threats of heavy rain after the meeting. Members were warmly greeted first by **Ken Murray** and then by **Rocco Disipio**.

At 1200 **President Jean** asked fellow Rotarians to proceed to the buffet, and to please remember to deposit their lunch tickets in the blue bowl by the plates. There was a decent crowd today making its way to the buffet.

**President Jean** began the 6<sup>th</sup> meeting of this Rotary Year. She asked **Pardeep Ahluwalia** to read an invocation. - Linda Flynn announced a big thank you to her team who gathered to label dictionaries: Ken, Ron, Dave, Doreen, Jean, Eric, Stu, Inna, Peter, Nigel and Mary, Joe Redhead and Joan
- **Rocco** drew our attention to the flyers on our tables for the "Swinging 40's Purple Dinner &Dance Gala" to be held on Sept. 24 @ the Centurion. Proceeds will go to support blood cancer patients and the Ottawa Hospital.
- **Brett** showed us the pictures chosen for our 2017 Cash Calendar. The committee hopes to have calendars in our hands by mid-September.
- **Doug Rowlands** told us he had an urgent need for help 1) to unload the mums shipment 2)at the mums warehouse 3) to run the mums delivery coordination desk. He is circulating sign-up folders.
- President's Announcements: Jean reminded club members that there is a \$10.00 charge for those who do not eat lunch. They are allowed a beverage and dessert.

And third, he wants us all to attend the District Conference in Ottawa October 28th and 29th especially the Saturday evening Gala. We will honour one another as serving Rotarians. A good turn- out from Ottawa will help attract more attendees from all over the District. After a full round of applause, Susan Diening thanked the DG for attending our meeting and passing on his message.
