

Program Dec 4: Dr. William McIntyre, Pediatric Surgeon- Classification Talk

PROGRAM:

Marilyn Letts now introduced our Speaker, Dr. Bill McIntyre.

Bill was born in 1936 in Ottawa, he was the 7th of 8 boys, he went to St George's Public School St. Patrick's High School. His undergraduate science degree was from University of Toronto at St Michael's College and on the advice of one of his brothers, who had succumbed to polio, went into medicine instead of engineering like his other brothers had done. He took his medical degree from the University of Ottawa graduating in 1961. He and his classmate Wilbur Keon rotated internships at the Civic Hospital working 24 hour shifts at a time. He did a surgery and a pathology residency at Montreal General and then left to go to North Carolina in 1960's where he first saw the racial discrimination against the black citizens in the southern US.

He entered a four-year residency in orthopedics at Columbia Presbyterian Medical Centre in New York. At one clinical rotation at the Harlem Hospital he saw the poor treatment of black patients versus white ones both in staff levels and equipment.

Bill married Mary Frances Gleeson in 1960 while in medical school and subsequently had three girls in quick secession, a gap of six years then they adopted a boy and then had another boy one year afterwards. From these children he now has 5 grandchildren.

After three years in the USA, in 1967, he returned to Ottawa, narrowly escaping the draft for the Vietnam War and joined the orthopedic staff at The Civic Hospital where they treated both adults and children.

He became the Medical Director of the Children's Treatment Center in 1971 and remained there for 27 years. When CHEO opened in 1974 he was appointed the 1st chief of the division of orthopaedic surgery where he remained for 19 years. This is where he met **Merv Letts** in 1990's.

Bill began to slow down a few years ago and now worked 2 days a week for the Medical Devices Bureau of Health Canada as an orthopaedic medical advisor.

Bill attributed much of his success was his dear wife of 57 years, Mary Frances Gleeson. Unfortunately, Mary, though a non-smoker, was diagnosed with lung cancer in January 2016 and she passed away peacefully at home in November 2017. To honour her, **Bill** is promoting a foundation to further lung cancer research in her name

Merv thanked Bill for the comprehensive and interesting overview of his life, his wife and family and his career.

HAPPY DOLLARS

-**President Pardeep** was happy that after 8 weeks he was able to set up a bank account as a UK non-resident.
