THE FREE READING PROGRAM

Ken Murray stood in for the vacationing Bob Harrison to introduce to us and, he hopes, via us to our friends and contacts The Free Reading Program. This program seeks to help children who are struggling with their reading and language skills. **Ken** referred us to the RCWO website rcwo.org where, on the right-hand side of the main page, there is a link to the program, which now has 117,000 student beneficiaries, all of them students between kindergarten and Grade 4. We are encouraged to visit this site, consider participating and proposing potential beneficiaries, and reporting our comments and suggestions back to Bob. Ken said that the site is easy to use and that the program designs itself to meet each student's needs and abilities. Parents and teachers can use it as a tool, and enroll others through their own sign-in site, so that they can monitor and help those in their care. We should feel free to explore it and find others who can benefit from its support. When we refer people to the program through the RCWO site the program will go with our logo. Schools,
