Carol Bell Thompson told us **Marcia Armstrong** had asked that her Introduction be short so as not to detract from **Marcia's** Classification Talk. So, **Carol** gave the podium to **Marcia** without further ado.

Marcia had grown up on a farm in northern Ontario and had learned about hard work and to cope with unexpected problems. She illustrated the latter point with an amusing anecdote about having to leave the dinner table to retrieve their cows which had strayed on to a local airport runway. Her mother had stressed that she should always do her best and her father had taught that she should never refuse to do something just because she was a girl.

She had married and accompanied her husband as he moved to new workplaces during his career and then on her own after 25 years of marriage when he died. While he worked on his PhD she got a degree in geography. While her husband taught in Windsor she taught high school Sarnia. After a stint in Winnipeg they moved to Guelph where Marcia became director of a rural development research project. In Sackville, New Brunswick she was not only occupied raising three young children but got involved starting a farmers' market to which in due course was added a store -"Just the Thing"- which is still in business selling the work of local artisans. She also qualified for a realtor licence and, with her husband, found the time to buy and renovate a badly dilapidated house.

In due course the family moved to Ottawa. **Marcia** took up her membership in the Canadian Federation of University Women where she met **Carol Bell Thompson.** There followed jobs with the Ottawa Children's Treatment Centre, Gene Whelan

(of the green hat), the Ottawa Carleton regional government, the clothing store Cleo, policy development with Health Canada and then Agriculture and Agrifood Canada and finally operations director of Pancreatic Cancer Canada. And she is not idle now. She volunteers with Ten Thousand Villages, sings in a church choir, is learning the clarinet with the Ottawa New Horizons Band (Interesting group. See

http://ottawanewhorizons.com/) and is active in Rotary
