Doug Rowlands attended the 2016 graduation ceremony at A.Y. Jackson Secondary School in Kanata where he presented the Julia Hill Bursary to Katie Oickle. He read from an email in which she thanked the RCWO for the bursary which will support her studies for a degree in bio-medical science at the University of Ottawa in the Fall with a goal to pursuing medicine in the future.

Phil Bronsther announced a joint fundraiser with the Canadian chefs federation that will be held in the spring of 2017. Tony Grande, who is a pending new RCWO member, will be chairing the Committee to organize the fundraiser and we will soon be getting information about dates, location, and fundraising activities for that exciting event!

Doug Heyland gave a warm introduction to **Pardeep Ahluwalia** as he prepared to give his classification talk. **Pardeep** walked us through an entertaining and light-hearted account of his extensive career in academia and the public service, from his birth in India, his youth and academic education in England, to the opportunities in life that brought him to Canada.

We learned of his contributions to the field of science in Canada as he managed work in disciplines such as toxicology, psychopharmacology and sub-atomic particle physics amongst many sciences. With the skills of an accomplished storyteller, he entertained us as he shared his career progression in the public service that positioned him as witness to some important historical events in what he referred to as the "golden age in physics in Canada". One of those events was the 1998 opening ceremony for the cutting-edge Sudbury Neutrino Observatory (SNO) that is located 2 kilometres deep in the active Creighton nickel mine in Sudbury Ontario. **Pardeep** told us of the honour he felt at having been part of history at that event surrounded by 5 Nobel laureates in physics, as well future Canadian laureate, Dr. Arthur McDonald of Queens University, who won the Nobel prize for his rsearch in physics in 2015. Those were exciting times.

His skills and knowledge, and the ease with which he could learn new scientific disciplines and adapt to new surroundings, brought him to contribute to the development of national scientific policy development in Canada. His contributions include his work in physical and mathematical sciences at the Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council (NSERC); in large-scale research projects at the Chief Scientist's Office at Industry Science and Technology; as a Canadian representative at international organizations (the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD), the International Human Frontier Science Program, and the Canadian Genomics Program); as senior executive in the fields of forestry, health, education and social policy at the Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA), Natural Resources Canada (NRCan), and the Department of Fisheries and Oceans (DFO).

We have no doubt that he will bring the same level of enthusiasm for learning and contribution to society as he begins his well-deserved retirement.

After we warmed up our vocal chords one more time, accompanied by **Rod Holmes** on the keyboard (we truly are the singing club) we sang the Happy Birthday song to **Chris Wanna**, **Joseph Redhead**, **Fred Sirotek**, and **Graeme Fraser**.
