Resisting the urge to babble on about shared experiences with fellow former Trade Commissioner **Robert Shaw-Wood**, your editor briefly noted a few points about his work and his experience as a Rotarian and let **Rob** get on with his Classification Talk.

And that was a good thing as we were an appreciative audience and for the small share **Rob** had time to give us of the stories he had prepared. "Tuan-tuan dan puan-puan" (Gentlemen and ladies) was Rob's opening in Bahasa Malaysia; he would come back to Malaysia later. Meanwhile he told us he had been born in Mntreal, moved to Ottawa and in due course gone to Brookfield HS where he had met **Gaye Moffett**. University in Ottawa and Calgary and back to Ottawa foran MBA from the Norman Paterson School of International

Affairs and then to what is now called Global Affairs for jobs doing trade analysis, support to Canadian business in honing their export skills and the more interesting postings abroad to help Canadian companies on the ground there. He needed care when asked to support visa applications and endorse questionable Canadian visitors He had served in several countries and told us of interesting experiences in places like the Philippines

In Malaysia he had organised trade shows to promote Canadian products and at one had had Stephen Yan of CBC TV's Wok with Yan fame do cooking demonstrations. Besides sales promotion he had arranged Canadian minister visits and arranged business visits and done economic analysis and market reports. A regular report was on asbestos still used in some countries to make asbestos cement pipes and roofing. Contact with Malaysian asbestos users had led to a memorable chug-a-lug contest with the industry association chairman. On another occasion a Canadian engineering company had done a hydro power feasability study financed by Canadian aid but seemed be being excluded from consideration for project execution. On following up **Rob** had been angrily asked by the official in charge as what the study had meant by recommending sensitivity to aboriginal rights when Canada had "murdered most of its aboriginals". Less pleasant was the execution in Malaysia of two Australians for drug smuggling and the constant worry the foolhardy young Canadians might ignore the warnings and take the

To Jim Maxwell whose cousin who had been cheated out of an Asian venture by his Asian partner Rob answered that such cases were not that common but that also Canadian companies needed to be at least as careful in Asias as they would be in Canada and some were not. In sum **Rob** left his audience wanting more of his stories and anecdotes and **Victor Mazzola** thanked
