The Gates foundation will, through another 3 years, match Rotary contributions 2/1 up to US\$100 million. Rotary's goal is to raise US\$50 million. "Our quiet, mighty mouse", **Joan Heyland,** has searched for and helped chose our RI scholarship candidates, served on our 60th Anniversary Planning, chaired our Membership Committee and would do just about anything asked of her. In appreciation she was presented with the President's Rose.

The Program

Gaye Moffett introduced our speaker. Peggy Taillon is a former Executive Director of Ontario's Mental Health Implementation Task Force and was Vice President of the Ottawa Hospital and is now President of the Bruyere Foundation

Immediately, Peggy Taillon took us back to 2007 when, in need of a break from a high pressure job in Ottawa, she visited the Asembo Bay Women for Development on the shores of Lake Victoria in

western Kenya with a friend active in development. The Asembo Bay group tries to address the problems caused by AIDS, Malaria TB and poverty. The group, hard pressed in caring for AIDS orphans and other effectively parentless children asked for help in caring for with baby about to be born to a 14-year-old mother traumatized by a pregnancy she neither expected nor wanted and incapable of taking care of the baby. Peggy had been thinking of adopting a child work and saw this as her moment and volunteered. She and the mother met and when Devlin was 11 days old, his mother gave him up. Little did Peggy know of the pitfalls of Kenya's adoption laws. For one thing adoption by single women was prohibited. By 15 months of persistence and hard work, her case reached the court. The judge announced that he intended to deny the adoption request. Peggy made an impassioned reply that caused the judge to relent and permit the adoption thus creating a precedent in Kenya law. What a beautiful story.

When the adoption went through Peggy founded Hera Mission of Canada to support the activities of the Asembo Bay women. (Hera means 'love' in the Luo language they speak there.) Today through the Hera Mission, Peggy is working to raise \$20,000 to create irrigation in Western Kenya in response to severe drought conditions.

Joan Heyland thanked Peggy for her incredible story and wished her well in continuing her journey with Devlin.

President Jean reminded us that we are Rotary Serving Humanity and not to forget to ask ourselves, of the next person we meet, "Would I like to spend more time with them?" Invite them to Rotary.
