Joe Redhead gave a rundown on the status of Mums 2018. We are getting a good response from guidance counsellors at local high schools to recruit student delivery help. 5400 plants have been ordered. This year the plants will arrive, and deliveries start on the last Wednesday of September (the 26<sup>a</sup>) rather than the Thursday as previously. Other activities are on track. Let's have another good year.

Continuing to Youth Service, **Joe** told us that our club had named two delegates to the Rotary Youth Leadership Academy (RYLA) in June and could now sponsor a third free.

**Caroline De Witt** reported on the 2017 Cash Calendar sales were up 27%. Our partners outsold us with Kemptville RC accounting for 63% of the sales total. Net revenue was nearly \$42,000, significantly over that of 2016. She attributed the improved results to the earlier program launch and better internal communications. For 2018 they intend to continue using pictures from Club photographers. Go through your archives and take more photographs.
