**Carol Bell Thompson** introduced our guest speakers. Dawn Cooper spent her professional life in Fundraising and Nonprofit Management roles. She retired after managing the Canadian Cancer Society Ottawa office and immediately transitioned to pursuing her love for health care and fundraising on the board of Hospice Care Ottawa (HCO). She is blessed in having three daughters and six grandchildren of whom respectively two and four live in Ottawa. Susan McIntosh is HCO Manager of Fund Development

Formed in 2013 by the amalgamation of the Hospice at May Court and Friends of Hospice Ottawa, Hospice Care Ottawa (HCO) was established to provide physical, emotional, social and bereavement support to individuals and their families with compassionate, high quality, end of life care. With our aging population and with most people preferring to pass in either their homes or facilities other than hospitals, HCO needs about 60-80 rooms. It has 9 hospice beds at May Court and 10 at a facility in Kanata and is fundraising for more. Care is volunteer driven. There are more than 1,000 local volunteers, and this mighty volunteer base means the cost per patient/resident per day is \$400 as opposed to \$1,000 in hospital. HCO is driven by the adage "We cannot add days to your life, we can add life to your days". With this in mind Dawn is asking the 10 Rotary clubs in Ottawa, to donate \$100,000 to the HCO capital campaign. Should we do so, HCO will name one room at its Ruddy Shenkman House facility in Kanata, as the "Rotary Room".

Carol Waters thanked our guest speakers and called for questions. Don Butler asked how HCO, with its limited resources, chooses from the many interested. Dawn responded that some would not benefit from hospice care. HCO offers palliation and comfort only and cannot provide the care needed by those who require serious medical assistance. For the rest, HCO speaks with family doctors, social workers and family members to select the most appropriate patients. Obviously, there are no waiting lists and there are times that the facilities operate at less than capacity. There was a brief exchange with **Doug Heyland** on the possibility of HCO adding to its facilities in the Glebe and Kanata with care provision in rural parts of Ottawa.

**Carol Waters** again thanked our guest speakers giving them our usual memento and a donation of \$25 for them to Polio Plus

**President Jean** then presented a Rotary cheque for \$5,000 to Hospice Care Ottawa as a contribution to its fundraising.
