PROGRAMME: CELEBRATING CLUB INITIATIVES

1) Mums for Thanksgiving

Marcia Armstrong gave a PowerPoint presentation on the results: gross revenue was \$86,180 providing just under \$44,000 to be shared by the 13 partners based on their shares of sales and deliveries of the 5581 plants. In addition to that share RCWO received a project management fee for a total project return of about \$37,000. (If you would like a copy of the PowerPoint please ask) **Marcia** thanked the many who participated in this year's campaign and handed out cheques for their shares of the revenue to: RC- Ottawa Stittsville; RC- Nepean Kanata; RC – South Nepean; RC- Hunger for Health; Parkdale Food Centre; Caldwell Family Centre; and finally, the Amazing Race. **2)** Post-Tornado Relief

Dave Morton reminded us of our Club mandate to seeks ways to help the community, including assistance to impacted by the September 22 tornados that hit the Ottawa area. The Community Services Committee has agreed to donate funds to the Salvation Army and the Ottawa Food Bank system in support of their tornado relief activities.

GUEST SPEAKERS

Dave Morton introduced Michael Maidment, CEO of the Ottawa Food Bank, an organization that has an important impact on the community.

Michael Maidment indicated that 38,400 people in Ottawa use emergency food centers, and that 1/3 of these people are children. Food insecurity in Ottawa is real. There are 55,000 people in total who need food, and the Ottawa Food Bank is there to help people who lack a voice to advocate. "We care to make their lives a little better" ... But we need to go beyond just alleviating hunger and address the cause of hunger which is poverty. Although the Food Bank is not political – it serves everyone – Maidment urged us to "get political" to address poverty by advocating more affordable housing in Ottawa; and a basic guaranteed income for everyone.

Dave Morton thanked Michael Maidment for his inspiring talk.

Captain Jeff Arkell of the Salvation Army then expressed gratitude for the donations from RCWO and other clubs which helped the Salvation Army to be ready and on site immediately following the tornados with many services, including meals for the people affected, for the volunteers, and for the first responders. Volunteers drove around to deliver pizzas and warm drinks donated by Pizza Pizza to comfort people who were devastated by the damage.

CHEQUE PRESENTATIONS

Dave Morton presented Club cheques for \$750 to the Salvation Army and for \$3,500 to the Ottawa Food Bank and an additional cheque, for \$740, from Bushtukah staff with company match, also to the Food Bank.

John Wilson then presented a cheque for \$559 from RC Renfrew to the Ottawa Food Bank
