The Rotary Foundation

Ron Scott reviewed aspects of the Foundation supported by Bob Harrison, Linda Flynn, Merv Letts Joan Heyland and with a contribution from Doug Rowlands absent with a cold.

- A short video reviewed the origin and evolution of the Rotary Foundation from an endowment proposed in 1917 by then Rotary President Arch Klumph for the "purpose of doing good in the world"
- EREY (Every Rotarian Every Year) contributes to the Annual Fund which is separate from Polio Plus. RCWO has averaged US\$100 per year and now targets US \$125
- After 3 years one half of Annual Fund comes back to the originating District The other half goes to Global Grants
- The funds to the District District Designated Funds- can be used for District Simplified Grants (in our District DSGs fund some of the WO International Service Committee projects in Africa and Dictionary 4 Life in which now 15 clubs participate). DDF can also be used to apply for Global Grants
- Global Grant funding is matched to funds from Districts and other sources to fund demonstrably sustainable projects of at least US \$30,000, in one or more of the RI Areas of Focus. Recently a lower rate of donations has prompted consideration of limiting grant availability.
- RF funds Peace Fellowships and scholarships to study in the Areas of Focus. We should tell the RF Committee now of people we think might qualify for these. As a first a medical student from France has received support for studies in our District starting in 2017.
- RCWO had convinced the city of Ottawa to recognize October 29 as World Polio Day.

Last year WO had contributed \$20,000 to the | Jen Soucy- LiveWorkPlay had been awarded anti-polio campaign and with government and Gates Fund matching that would be \$80,000. Rather than 'Polio Plus' the term now is 'Global Polio Eradication Initiative'. Immunization using attenuated live virus is being discontinued. Unlike many diseases polio must have a human host. This makes eradication possible. If no humans have the disease the virus dies out. There were only 32 cases of wild virus this year.

There are various ways of donating to the RF and bequests are also welcome. Donate by the Christmas meeting Dec 13 for credit in 2016.
