Highlights of the Census

Phil Bronsther now introduced our guest speaker Dr. Doug Norris, Senior Vice President and Chief Demographer at Environics Analytics. Dr. Norris assists companies, government agencies and not for

profit organizations in using Census and statistical information for planning and marketing purposes. He studied at McGill University and earned a Ph.D. in Biostatistics and Demography from John Hopkins University. After a 30 year career at Stats Canada Dr. Norris joined Environics in 2006.

Dr. Norris started his by reminding us that each week our demographics and population is changing. Canada is the fastest growing G8 country with an annual growth rate approaching 1.0% mainly by immigration. Urban centers are growing and smaller centers are in decline. The rate of growth west of Ontario is far greater than east of Ontario. Women in professions are rapidly expanding while high unemployment of young males is a cause for concern. Canada will continue to grow faster than other G-8 nations but at a slower rate dependent upon immigration policies. In 15 years 1 in 4 Canadians will be over the age of 65; visible minorities will get bigger and our population will be about 50 million in 2060. Economic growth will slow as the population ages and matures.

Jim Maxwell asked if Japan could teach us anything about dealing with an aging population but Dr. Norris said that he had not studied the Japanese situation. Jennifer Ahde asked whether or not there is a correlation between regional population decline and changing industrial demands and the ability of young males to find meaningful work. Dr. Norris responded by pointing out that many jobs are lost in small towns and this has a direct impact on young male employment.

Answering **Brian Hartley** Dr Norris put the world's current population at about 7.2 Billion and growing to about 10 to 11 Billion people at the current rate

Marcia Armstrong thanked our guest speaker in the usual manner noting that it will be nice to have the long form census back so that Dr. Norris and others can do their very fine analysis of the data.
