COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Community Service – **Dave Morton** He highlighted many successful community activities:

- -Dictionary 4 Life got 36 members involved with our partners this year in 22 schools;
- support again for the Youville Centre in collaboration with the Kanata Club;
- continued support for Cornerstone;
- **Carol Waters'** efforts for the Drop-in Centre on Main Street;
- the Campership program continues to engage young people;
- we are now involved in the new Trips for Kids Ottawa site in Carleton Place;
- support continues for the Christie Lake Camp;
- **Fred Christie** is spearheading the City View United Church Christmas Hamper program for Caldwell avenue residents. **Dave** provided a summary of requests for assistance that the Committee had approved. He finished by urging members to tell the Committee about needs that they see as it is looking for smaller programs where our contribution can make a difference.

Finance - Hadi Mortada

Overall, the profits/loss situation for the club looks good. Our equity is not in the

red and fundraising by projects is going well. He noted that the interest for the Cash Calendars comes out of the GIC, and that there are fewer bank charges this year than last. We still need to increase our revenues, and seeking website sponsorship will be a priority. Rotary International dues not only increased this year, but as also paid in US dollars, exchange rate fluctuations can add to expenses. The good news is that we are doing better in accommodating the costs of guest lunches in the budget. He thanked Mary and Joe Wattie for their support and guidance throughout the year.

International Service – **Bob Harrison** (on behalf of Navin Parekh away in Uganda) Using a world map to show project locations **Bob** reported on the scope of RCWO's reach around the globe and highlighted 3 programs: Bea Osome has now constructed water wells in 14 communities in Kenya, and in one community, a small surplus of ISC funds left over from a well construction project was used to buy school uniforms for the children; Navin Parekh's CanUgan program to supply tricycles, white canes and other assistive devices has so far provided 900 people the mobility and confidence to be independent and participate in everyday activities; Suan Cross's Project Chance in Nairobi purchased a huge water tank to make potable water available in a droughtstricken community, thereby helping them address the problems of malaria, cholera and diarrhea that are prevalent in drought conditions.

Mums for Thanksgiving – **Don Butler** It was another good year with over 5,300 plants sold. The numbers are slightly down. Club members, particularly the Waters, sold more and partners less. Total

sales this year were \$80,700 as compared to \$81,650 for 2016. The net revenue was \$37,146 + HST rebate which has not been calculated yet (was about \$2,000 last year). The committee went back to purchasing the flowers from 'One Floral', the company that had been before 2016 when quality problems forced a change. There had been a marked improvement in the quality of the plants this year. He announced that the new Chair for next year's Mums for Thanksgiving campaign will be Marcia Armstrong.
