The Program – Growing the Flavours of the Season, by Jim and Cameron McGregor

Suren Gupta introduced Jim McGregor and his son Cameron. **Suren** had met Jim in Florida during one of his winter vacations and had discovered that the McGregor family, and especially Jim, followed the philosophy of Rotary very closely. The family served their community as a viable business and through donations of farm produce and money to health care organizations, schools and charity events in their community. Jim is first to the podium and presents a brief account creating his farming operation. He then hands over to Cameron who details of the growth of the family business, the communities that provide labour (Jamaican seasonal farm workers are employed each year, with several being repeat workers), the various technologies used in farming operations, and the variety of products that are produced. The family

had once sold through major grocers in Ontario, but had abandoned this sales avenue some years now in preference to selling directly to the public. **Frank Cranton** thanks the McGregors for a wonderful and informative presentation and presents father and son with small tokens of our appreciation.
