Bob Harrison presented an impressive record of work in Kenya by **Bea Osome** and her husband, Benson. Since 2008, they have provided leadership and have created a safe water supply for 31,000 students and villagers in rural Kenya. Even when **Bea** had health problems and could not participate,

Benson carried on their work. In recognition of this superb record **Bob Harrison** announced that Benson was now a Paul Harris Fellow.

The Program...

Fred Christie, himself formerly active in the aerospace field, introduced his son Iain, now Executive Vice President of the Aerospace Industries Association of Canada. Holding a Master degree in space technology from Dalhousie University and a career divided between NASA and the Canadian Space Agency Iain is well qualified to talk about the development and future of space in Canada.

Christie started by saying space activity to Canada would be like the navy to the growth of the 5th century BC Athenian empire. He quoted John Kennedy on doing such things, "...because they are hard...serve to organize and measure the best of our energies and skills"

He listed an impressive record of Canadian participation in space:

We were the third nation in space.

One of five countries whose astronauts have shaken hands in space.

One of five nations to have a commander in space

8000 Canadians depend on the business generated by space.

Canadian space related companies spend on R & D at a rate higher than any other Canadian industry.

Over the last decade, government spending on space has declined. The new government has indicated openness to changing this and Christie sketched space industry use of Twitter and other media to draw government attention to the need for increases in and expansion of space activities. Our speaker was hopeful of new money in the next budget.

He was thanked by Victor Mazzola.

Larry Chop reminded us with a picture of our presenting over \$11,000 for refugee resettlement and showed us pictures of the arrival in September of three Iraqi refugees our donation made possible. Len Baird was happy to announce that Marathon Bridge was expecting another active year.

Ron Scott told us that our total contributions to The Rotary Foundation Annual Fund for 2015-16

were down but our support to eradicate Polio was very strong at over \$20,900. He was also able to tell us that our all-time contributions to The Rotary Foundation Annual Fund totalled over US\$455,400.
