Lorraine Bentley, Option Bytown: 27 years of building community

The club met on yet another sunny day this summer. Members were met by **Dave Morton** and **Marilyn Letts** as they entered the main hall at St. Elias. **Joe Redhead** and **Bill Rolph** collected payment and distributed lunch tickets for the bowl. Everyone collected their steak stir-fry lunch and found seats quickly, especially those with Spinoff duties. Someone commented that the Spinoffs have seemed more flavourful recently, and I noted that as maybe a good thing.

Cletus Peters took the names of our visitors, of which there were quite a few. One was quite noticeable in her brightly decorated Rotary exchange-student jacket. - The best announcement was from **Ron** "Dollman". He highlighted the benefits of helping with the Dictionary for Life campaign in a format reminiscent of David Letterman. It is a very impactful program for the Grade 3 students it reaches many of whom have never owned a book. For volunteers: it is an easy, inexpensive, and fun way to help out our local community.
- The second best announcement, and I may be biased here, was **Ken Sparks** talking

Our main speaker, Lorraine Bentley, is from Options Bytown which provides permanent housing to those needing it in downtown Ottawa. After being introduced by **Sucha Mann**, Lorraine argued that access to housing promotes inclusion in the community, and told us there are thousands of people currently in need. The organization currently maintains four multi-unit buildings and

facilitates support services and peer-support activities. Units are barrier free, ie. no abstinence or job requirements, and the rent is geared to each tenant's financial capacity. They maintain a 60/40 men-to-women ratio, and have one building that is strictly for female tenants. Lorraine told us of some of the success stories coming from the charity, and then showed a video showing testaments to the many benefits. **Henry Akanko** thanked Lorraine and gave her the usual mementos.

The lunch agenda ran quickly today, so we were ahead of schedule for Happy Dollars collection. Luckily, since Rotarians were exceptionally happy today. All the nice weather must be helping:
