Molly Gautreau from J.H. Putman PS introduced by **Bob Harrison**. Interestingly Molly now attends Glebe High School so she can study Latin. Molly's parents were with her.

Sabby Duthie told us about Kate Kelly, the recipient from Pinecrest Middle School. Unfortunately, Kate, now at Woodroffe HS, was unable to attend as she had to write 2 exams.

Jen Soucy introduced Jayden and Courtney, teachers at Woodroffe High School, to speak to the 4 Way Test Award winners. First up Jayden, no stranger to our Club, spoke of the highly successful Interact Club at Woodroffe High. Jayden has a

thirst for international cooperation and 12 to 13 years ago he founded an International Club at Woodroffe. With Jen Soucy, Jen Adhe and other New Generation Committee members urging Jayden has transitioned this group to become an Interact Club. This club has a 24-hour Awake Fund Raiser held on the last Friday in November. Last year between 150 and 200 students at this event raised over \$6,500. The Interact Club has paired with a school in Kenya and in the past 5 years has contributed more than \$35,000 towards a school building and lab and to help with teacher salaries. Today, Woodroffe High School is a truly international school with at least 56 nationalities represented in the student body. The Interact Club is active with Habitat for Humanity in El Salvador and Peru and last year provided West Ottawa with a cheque for \$1,000 to help towards our Refugee project with St Matthias Church. Thank you, Jayden, for an excellent presentation.

Next up, Courtney, walked us through being a new student in high school. Her advice to the 4 Way Test Award Winners is to get involved. Obviously school is important but there is much to learn outside the classroom. Consider sports, music, international affairs, clubs.... Just get involved and the high school experience will be far more rewarding. She told us about the newly offered International Certificate Program which involves learning an international language other than English and French, taking courses in subjects such as international law and politics and 100-200 hours of international work which can be done through organizations such as Red Cross or Habitat for Humanity.
