

Ruth Martin Award for Community Service

Conferred upon Women's Initiatives for Safer Environments (WISE) on June 25, 2024

"W" "I" "S" "E" Ottawa, a non-profit women's organization, dedicates itself to promoting safety and ending violence against women in the Ottawa area. Their tireless efforts aim to make Ottawa "SAFER FOR WOMEN, SAFER FOR ALL!"

WISE Ottawa focuses on crime prevention and safety for women and girls.

They provide tangible solutions to combat violence and enhance safety in neighbourhoods. Their work is community-driven, responsive, and thorough.

In response to sexual assaults in downtown Ottawa during the 1990s, a group was formed to address violence against women and women's safety in public areas.

The group assessed safety in various environments, including parking lots, underground garages, open spaces, and shopping centers.

Shockingly, 50% of women experience at least one instance of physical or sexual violence before the age of 16.

WISE Ottawa offers a variety of programs:

WISE Ottawa conducts Safety Audits to assess and improve safety in public spaces.

They offer free basic car and bike safety and mechanics Workshops.

WISE Ottawa Collaborates with Netroots, University of Ottawa to raise awareness about intimate partner dating violence.

They **Engage Youth** (ages 8-12) in discussions about masculinity, gender norms, and violence against women.

WISE Ottawa offers **Personal Safety Workshops**. These workshops are tailored to different circumstances, including women from diverse backgrounds, speaking different languages, and newcomers to Canada.

WISE Ottawa works hard to create a **Safer Environment**. They consult on constructing new spaces to ensure they don't raise safety concerns.

They firmly believe that making the community safer for women and vulnerable groups benefits everyone.

The valuable work and commitment of **WISE Ottawa** deserve recognition.
