AN INTRODUCTION TO SHERLOCK HOLMES: FROM BAKER STREET TO SHERLOCK, ELEMENTARY AND BEYOND



Sherlock Holmes is one of the most well-known and enduring figures in literature. Since his introduction in print in 1887, Holmes and his trademark deerstalker hat, pipe and magnifying glass have become universally recognized symbols for detectives.

Harrison "Terry" Hunt has been a Sherlock Holmes buff since high school. He became an active Sherlockian after his retirement in 2008 and is a member of several Holmesian groups on the East Coast, including The Baker Street Irregulars, to which he was inducted in 2014. Before his retirement, Terry was Senior Curator of History and Supervisor of Historic Sites for the Nassau County, NY Department of Parks. He holds a master's degree in History Museum Studies from the Cooperstown Graduate Program, which is where he met our President John Baule.
