PRESIDENT JAMES DEGRASSE (JIM, JIMMY, J-DAWG)



Jim (James, Jimmy, J-Dawg) grew up in Yakima, Washington attending Robertson Grade School, Wilson Junior High, and Eisenhower High School graduating in 1981. He started his college education at Yakima Valley College and transferred to the University of Washington by the end of his freshman year, where he earned a degree in Finance from the Foster School of Business in 1985. After college he received a call from his father telling him of an "opportunity" for the family business (Triangle Auto Supply) to acquire a new store in Spokane. Jim joined the family business and after a few years in Spokane moved to Kennewick to help with the branch operations there. In 1992, he returned to Yakima as a

buyer for all three stores.

The family business was started in Yakima in 1921 by his grandfather Merch, continued on in the second generation by his dad, John, and was purchased by Jim and his brother, Todd in 2003. The business expanded in 2011 with the purchase of the local NAPA store. The DeGrasse brothers were running three parts stores (Triangle, NAPA and eCommerce) when things changed (for the better) in 2021. Just as they were getting ready to expand, another "opportunity" presented itself and after 100 years in business the DeGrasse family sold their operations.

Jim has served on numerous boards including serving as president of the Yakima Schools Foundation and the Yakima Tennis Club. He was also actively involved with the PTA and Booster Clubs as his girls grew up. Jim joined Yakima Rotary in 2003 as a third generation Rotarian joining his grandfather (joined 1934) and father (joined 1960). Jim served on the Board of Yakima Rotary from 2010 to 2013 in the role of Treasurer. He was the co-chair of the Rotary Auction in 2012. Today, he serves on the Yakima Trust board as Treasurer.

While Jim has a lot of passions (mostly tennis and cars) he is very passionate about Rotary. He's served as committee chair on 8 different committees, recruits his whole family to help with Operation Harvest every year, has hosted two Youth Exchange students, and has been on three World Community Service Projects (Mexico, Belize and Honduras).

The greatest joy for Jim is his family. He met his wife, Dawn when he moved back to Yakima in 1992; they married in 1996. They have two beautiful daughters Madeleine (Maddie) and Jacqueline (Jackie). Dawn graduated from WSU and has been a public-school teacher for over 30 years. Yes, that means they have a split house — Cougs and Dawgs! He is inspired by Dawn and her unwavering devotion to education. He feels that Rotary is his way to give back to his community and help make a difference the way Dawn does every day for her students.
