AMBER STRUNK LIGO HANFORD OBSERVATORY



LIGO, the Laser Interferometer Gravitational-Wave Observatory, was designed to open the field of gravitational-wave astrophysics through the direct detection of gravitational waves. Although it is considered one observatory, LIGO comprises four facilities across the United States: two gravitational wave detectors and two university research centers. Hanford, Washington is home to one of the gravitational wave detectors.

Education is a part of what LIGO does. In 2019, the Washington State Capital Budget included \$7.7 billion to build a STEM Exploration Center that would provide an opportunity for close to 10,000 Washington students and public visitors to explore science in-the-making. In June 2022, the LIGO Exploration Center officially opened to the public.

As Education and Outreach Lead for LIGO's Hanford Observatory Amber Strunk enjoys sharing the fascinating physics, engineering, and technology necessary to detect gravitational waves with the public. She received a BS in Physics from Fort Hays State University before pursuing a master's in education from Arizona State University. Amber taught high school physics for seven years before joining the extraordinary team at LIGO.
