FRANCISCO F. IVARRA **RETURNING FROM VIETNAM**



The Vietnam war was the most unpopular war in our history. The draft was very unpopular and terrifying for young men who went from a normal life to combat in a few months.

Coming home for many created deep mental wounds. There was no "welcome home." Many were called names, spit on, and harassed.

Our speaker this week, Francisco Ivarra will share how the Vietnam Veterans have changed the VA system.

Francisco F. Ivarra is a Vietnam (1968-1969) combat veteran and Purple Heart recipient. An advocate for veterans since returning from Vietnam. Francisco joined the Department of Veterans Affairs as a Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder Counselor in Seattle. He researched PTSD on Vietnam veterans and served as a consultant to the Department of Veterans Affairs.

Francisco is a retired university professor of Social Stratification and Comparative Cultures. He currently serves as the Region 8 Director and President of the Washington State Council.
