

Small changes help to save money and reduce GHSs

What is Renewable Natural Gas?

Biogas is generated from organic material

 Primarily consists of methane, typically 50% - 60%

Potential Sources

- Anaerobic Digester Gas (from farm)
- Landfill Gas

Demand is customer driven

- Fixed Percent available 5%, 25%, 50% or 100%
- Additional cost helps support local biogas projects

Tilbury LNG in Delta: \$400m expansion completion early 2017




Benefits to the community

What is LNG?



- Natural Gas cooled until it condenses into a clear liquid.
- Stored at -162° in a "thermos" like storage container.
- LNG takes up far less space
- LNG (the liquid itself) is not flammable or explosive.

LNG from Tilbury goes to NWT, Van Isl.



- LNG supplied from our Tilbury facility will replace fuels such as diesel and oil
- Lower emissions by approx. 15-25%

Natural gas for transportation




Natural gas for vehicles, marine vessels


