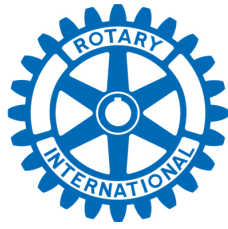

Silvester Schiele was the first club president not Paul Harris. Paul was the 3rd (third) club president and the first president of the National Rotary Association.

#3 B

The idea of the Rotary Club of Ladner actually began two years before the charter night. The president elect Bruce Ledingham of the Rotary Club of Marpole (now Rotary Club of Vancouver South) met with local businessman Dick Ferguson that led to the formation of the club. The first meeting of the provisional club was in November 1957. The club received its charter from Rotary International on December 27, 1957. 1958 – The Rotary Club of Ladner Charter Night was held on February 4, 1958. The first president was Dick Ferguson whose classification was Farm Machinery. The charter night celebration was held at the Astor Hotel in Vancouver. Nat Bailey was a charter member of the RC of Marpole later changed its name to RC of Vancouver South. The club met at the White Spot at 63 and Granville for many years on Mondays because the restaurant was closed on Mondays.

#7 B

Warren G. Harding Memorial – Commemorating the former 29th US president's visit to the park in the 1923, a week before his death. Designed by Charles Marega and unveiled in 1925. Located between the Stanley Park Pavilion and Malkin Bowl. Harding was an active Rotarian. He was the first US president to speak at a RI convention,
