Windsor St. Clair President Alan Drouillard says that losing the Charbonneau's to Mexico will be a great loss – particularly as both Phyllis and then Paul were scheduled to lead

April marks the last quarter of our current Rotary year. PE Phyllis has just returned from PETS with planning for next year in full swing; however as a club we have a number of important events and activities to complete before July 1.



Of utmost importance requiring the input of every member of the club in our **CLUB VISIONING EXERCISE**, taking place on Tuesday April 6, 2010 at the Riverside Library (6305 Wyandotte Street East). The session will start at 5:00 PM with dinner provided. It is anticipated the session will last 3 to 4 hours. The session will address these issues:

- What our Club stands for in the community we serve;
- The target membership size for our Club in 5 years;

- Identification of the attributes the Club will have;
- The top-three prioritized objectives for focusing efforts in each of the four Avenues of Service; and
- ▶ R e c o m m e n d a t i o n s f o r improvements in the Club's leadership development.

Facilitation will be led by experienced volunteers representing Rotary roles from PDG through PEN. Many members of the Vision TEAM are longtime Rotarians and knowledgeable about Rotary at local, district, and international levels.

This activity will serve to create the blueprint for the club, it's goals and objectives for the next 5 years. To be candid, I view non-participation in this exercise like an election: if you don't exercise your right to vote you don't have the right to complain about the government. If you don't participate in this exercise your ability to add *positive commentary* on club direction, activities and priorities over of the next five years will be somewhat diminished.

Each member will have two opportunities to provide initial input. First will be a questionnaire emailed to you in the next week. I would hope every member takes the opportunity to complete this questionnaire: if you are unable to attend due to scheduling conflicts please allow this to be your medium for input. However, this is just the beginning, and the work that goes into *fine tuning* the results of the questionnaire will take place on Tuesday night. So if you haven't confirmed your attendance on our website please do so ASAP. This exercise cannot be a success without your input.

RYLA makes learning life's lessons fun

Taylor Mathis, a high school junior from Orland Park, Illinois,, came home from a Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) event with lifelong friends, leadership skills, and the excitement of becoming a Rotary Youth Exchange student.

Mathis was one of more than 80 high school students from the Chicago area who participated in a RYLA event hosted by District 6450. Students spent three days taking part in outdoor and indoor activities that focused on leadership, conflict resolution, trust building, problem solving, and creativity.

"RYLA was simply an amazing program. I had so much fun," says Mathis. "The games we did weren't just games for fun, but actually were meaningful. I've implemented a lot of the leadership skills I learned into the programs I'm in at school."

Starting this summer, Mathis will spend her senior year studying in Germany as part of the Youth Exchange program. She credits RYLA with opening her eyes to different cultures and the possibility of experiencing them.

"RYLA is an effective way to combine Interactors, Rotaractors, and Youth Exchange students," says Linda Yates, district RYLA committee chair. "It creates great exposure to all the possibilities of Rotary."

The RYLA event included Reality Stores, a popular learning activity that presents students with financial situations they might face as adults. The experience encourages them to consider different career choices and helps them understand the challenges of single parenthood.

"The whole point of RYLA is to learn something while having fun," says Yates. "We want students to go home and spread the word to their friends about their experience."
