This recent building project was an enthusiastic team effort between Marlin and Benguerra Lodge and the Rotary Club of Windsor-St.Clair, Canada. The school suffered substantial damages after Cyclone Favio of 2007, and so renovations and enhancements have been ongoing ever since.
