TODAY'S PROGRAM

Darraugh Collins, the Site Director for Food Rescue US – Detroit.

Food Rescue US is an app-based, volunteer driven program working to feed people, not landfills. It began in Connecticut in 2011 and now has 39 locations in 22 states. The Detroit branch was formed in 2019 and now has 132 food donors, 700+ registered drivers (around 110 active), and 152 social service agencies that receive the donated food. Unlike Forgotten Harvest (also a food rescuer) the donated food is taken directly from the donor to the receiving agency.

The branch operates 7 days a week, accepts all types of food, and rescues food from locations like Whole Foods and Sam's Club but also from events (12,000lbs were saved from the 2023 Detroit Grand Prix), and when businesses suffer power outages.

Ms. Collins says that more people than you probably realize suffer from food insecurity, especially seniors and children. There is 69% food insecurity in Detroit. To learn more, please visit <u>www.foodrescue.us/site/food-</u>
