TODAY'S PROGRAM

Linda Dewey – The Kassel Mission

On 9/27/1944, thirty-five 445th Bomb Group B-24 bombers and 336 men who made up their crews, suffered the greatest single-day loss to a group from one airfield in aviation warfare history, all within minutes. Somehow, their group became separated from the 1,000 planes they were flying with before they were attacked.

Only four B-24s of the original thirty-five returned safely to Tibenham Airfield in Norfolk, England. None of the pilots had aerial battle experience and believed the flight would be merely a "milk run". Ultimately, 1/3 of the airmen were killed, 1/3 taken prisoner, and 1/3 returned to duty. A memorial has been erected in Ludwigsau, Germany to honor those who died on both sides that day. To learn more, please visit www.kasselmission.org.
