TODAY'S PROGRAM

Tucker Rossmaessler – International Samaritan.

International Samaritan.has been addressing poverty since 1994 and has developed into an organization that focuses on holistic support and education. Its mission is to walk hand-in-hand with people in garbage dump communities, along with those with a calling to help, to break the chains of poverty and to improve their lives together.

In these communities, the life expectancy is 35, one third of babies will die before their first birthday, and over 50% of children will drop out of school by 7th grade. To guide the children to a different life, on average \$3,000 is provided for each. This pays for tuition, school uniforms, medical needs, intent access, and leadership development.

Since 2019, the organization maintains a 75% success rate of scholars who either graduate or remain with them. The graduates, on average, earn two and a half times the income of the households from which they come. To learn more, go to www.intsam.org.
