## **TODAY'S PROGRAM**

Dennis Hyduk & JC Brooks, GP Sunrise Club – 2023 GP Run

Grosse Pointe Sunrise has organized the Grosse Pointe Run since the mid-1990s and it's the Club's largest fundraiser. Participants, which average 350-400 a year (with a max one year of 550). usually run a 5k or 10k (with wheelchair and walking options available). Three lanes are closed on Lakeshore from before Provencal to Warner.

The money raised from this event comes primarily from advertising. Grosse Pointe Magazine's next edition will have a section devoted to the Run. The Club has raised around \$50,000 this year, with an expectation of netting \$35,000. From a fundraising standpoint, each runner's registration fee is a wash, with revenue going to the purchase of food, beverages, and t-shirts. To make this event successful, volunteers are needed. It takes 40-50 people to register, set up food/beverages, and to marshall at all of the street corners to make sure that cars turning on Lakeshore remain in the lane farthest from Lake St. Clair. The high schools Interact Clubs help meet some of these needs but help from our Club would be greatly appreciated.
