Donna Hill – SAVeD (Save a Voiceless Dog Rescue)

With a long history of fostering dogs, especially pregnant ones, Ms. Hill and two others decided to form their own 501(c)3 rescue organization. Since starting in February 2024, SAVeD has rescued 38 dogs, incurring over \$7,500 in delivery, spaying, neutering, and other injury/illness costs. Their

fundraising activities, such as raffles and manning booths at events, have been very successful so far.

One of SAVeD's primary goals is to find foster families to get the dogs out of the animal shelters. They have a process to vet the homes to make sure they are compatible with temporarily caring for a dog and also making sure the home is a good fit, i.e., a busy family that's out of the house often should probably not foster a puppy.

SAVeD's mission is to be the unwavering voice for the voiceless dogs in our community. It is dedicated to providing a safe haven for abandoned, neglected, and abused dogs and works tirelessly to rehabilitate and find adopters. To learn more, go to www.savedrescue.com.
