The Family Center's new motto is *Empowering Families, Enriching Lives* with a mission to help build happier, healthier families. Its vision is to be the first source for building

connected, resilient families who thrive at every stage.

Fulfilling its mission, the organization hosted or participated in 101 programs last year. This included being the new administrators of the Grosse Pointe & Harper Woods Coalition (a school drug prevention program) and the Special Needs Resource Alliance. It has partnered with the ARC, Full Circle, and others to host a resource fair last year.

Other programs include QPR (suicide risk prevention) training, a Public Safety Night, an Addiction Panel, and a Women's Health Night. There is Narcan training at the GPW Community Center on 6/26. Its wellness programs include yoga, stress reducing breathing, and the planting of seeds for adults and in the schools. Chill rooms have also been placed in the schools to help students who feel overwhelmed so that they stay in school and can return to class.
