TODAY'S PROGRAM

Dr. Andrea Tuttle, GPPS Superintendent. An analysis of the Grosse Pointe School System determined that the costs needed to address repairs, maintenance, and salaries over the next 10 years would reach \$252 million. To address this, a sinking fund of \$110 million was established in 2024 and a \$120 million bond proposal is on the 11/4 ballot. There will be a zero tax-rate increase with this bond from the existing millage rate.

Of the \$120 million, \$60 will be directed to critical needs, such as boilers that need to be replaced and the remaining \$60 million will be allocated by community input, such as replacing the tennis courts at Elworthy Field. to attract and retain students and staff. The bond focuses heavily on infrastructure, which includes better safety/security with badges that can be deactivated if needed, and installing keypads to enter buildings.
