TODAY'S PROGRAM

Donald Campbell – Ethics and Professional Responsibility Law.

Mr. Campbell, a former Oakland County prosecutor, was a prosecutor/investigator for misconduct claims against attorneys and judges for the Michigan Supreme Court for ten years, and is now an adjunct professor at U of D Mercy Law School and defends

attorneys and judges against such claims.

Mr. Campbell talked about his most unusual legal case, rather than talking about ethics and professional responsibility. He figured with Covid "Zoom fatigue", the Club would prefer this.

The case occurred in 1990 when he was an Oakland County prosecutor, and it involved a bored group of boys/young adults wanting to form a gang and an unknown (at the time) unsolved mystery. (To say it was unusual, would be an understatement).
