TODAY'S PROGRAM

Kelly Boyd – New Member Presentation.

Kelly was born and raised in Canton, MI and is the youngest of five children. She received a degree in environmental studies at MSU and a college trip to Europe introduced her to Geographic Information Systems, which has been her career ever since.

Kelly worked for the NOAA for four years, mapping out coastal storms, surges, and flooding when Katrina hit. After a few years working for a company that dealt with the clean-up, she moved on to work for NASA for 18 years, where she was the lead contractor mapping across the agency. In April of this year, she joined the City of Detroit's Department of Innovation and Technology, where she is putting together an online mapping system for citizens and employees.

A member of the Mid-City New Orleans Rotary Club (2019-2020 President), its signature project was providing survivor packs for sexual assault victims. Kelly's hobbies include painting, reading, embroidery, biking, and trivia.
