Jordan Greene is a Research Specialist for Poverty Solutions, where she manages SummerWorks, the Washtenaw County Summer Youth Employment Program. SummerWorks is a university-community partnership that works to connect local young adults to opportunities for mentorship, building professional networks, exploring career and educational opportunities, and developing leadership skills. Prior to this role, Jordan worked as a research assistant for Poverty Solutions and at the Ginsberg Center furthering their mission of cultivating equitable partnerships to advance social change. She also managed the evaluation of a program that helped Detroit renters avoid displacement due to tax foreclosure. She holds a bachelor's degree in women's studies and a Master of Public Health degree in health behavior and health education, both from the University of Michigan. Jordan uses her Public Health background, as well as her commitment to community engagement and justice, to pursue equity in our local community and beyond.

Zoë Erb is responsible for implementing the activities and policies of the Washtenaw Summer Youth Employment Program, SummerWorks!, a university and community partnership that provides opportunities for local youth to obtain summer employment, mentorship, and professional development. Having previously held roles as a research assistant and a success coach for the program, Zoë is passionate about reducing educational disparities and closing opportunity gaps. She also works on projects that aim to alleviate homelessness using education data and to understand how to better support underserved communities. Her background is in workforce development, career advising, and nonprofits. Prior to returning to graduate school, she worked at a Seattle-based company that coaches nonprofits on fundraising. Zoë holds a Master of Higher Education degree from the University of Michigan and a bachelor's degree in Classics from Whitman College.
