

SEQUIM SUNRISE ROTARY FLAG DISPLAY PROJECT

Members of Sequim Sunrise Rotary sell subscriptions to individuals and groups in designated areas in Sequim to erect the United States flag five times a year for \$40.00. The five holidays are:

- President's Day
- Fourth of July
- Veterans Day
- Memorial Day
- Labor Day

Whenever the holiday is on a Monday, the flag is placed by Rotarians on Saturday morning and taken in on Monday evening. Whenever the holiday is on a Friday, the flag is placed on Friday morning and taken in on Sunday evening. If the holiday is on another weekday, the flag is placed and removed the same day. Revenue received from this project is used for charitable projects in the Sequim community and Rotary International projects (see page 2 for more information).

HOW THE FLAG IS DISPLAYED

Each display address has a 14 inch PVC pipe (sleeve) placed at ground level to serve as a flag pole holder. The PVC has a yellow or red cap on top. The location of the sleeve is marked either with a painted dot on the curb or a stainless washer driven into the pavement near the sleeve. The flag was manufactured in the United States.
