CHELSEA MINKLER, Gates Foundation Worldwide polio eradication initiative

Over the past three decades, the world has made tremendous progress toward the eradication of polio. In 1988—when wild polio virus was present in more than 125 countries and paralyzed 350,000 people every year, primarily young children-



the World Health Assembly set a goal to eliminate the disease, and the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) was launched. Since then, immunization efforts have reduced the number of cases by more than 99 percent, saving more than 13 million children from paralysis. India stopped the virus in 2011, and today, polio is found only in Afghanistan, Pakistan. In 2016, there were fewer than 40 cases reported globally. In 2017, there were 25 cases, 21 cases in 2018, and there were 61 cases in 2019 because of difficulties getting access to Middle East countries. Ms. Minkler the task for the anti--polio initiative is to define priorities by where these questions

1. Where is greatest need?

- 2. Where can we make biggest impact?
- Rotary has been working to eradicate polio for more than 30 years, has committed to raising

\$50 million a year to be matched 2-to-1 by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, amounting to \$150 million for polio eradication annually. Rotary has contributed more than \$1.9 billion to fight the disease, including matching funds from the Gates Foundation. "What is so exciting about Rotary's 30-year fight...not only are you eradicating one of the worst

diseases in history, you are also helping the poorest countries provide their citizens with better health and a better future. And getting to zero is incredibly inspiring as an achievement of humanity." - Bill Gates at the 2017 Rotary International Convention.

Ms. Minkler said what makes polio unique as an eradicable disease is because it only lives in

the human body, not in animals or in the air. Three steps field workers must take in countries in the farthest corners of the world.

- 1. Find the virus -- testing sewage and other places the virus might exist 2. Find where children have been infected
- 3. Vaccinate, vaccinate, vaccinate

Strong progress has continues as the initiative has pushed into some of the toughest corners of the world. In the past five years, the global polio burden has decreased from over 600 cases to

Essential Public Speaking Skills To speak effectively, recognize that speaking is a craft.

- Communication and leadership are inseparable.
- · Know your goals.
- Grab attention, introduction, 3 to 5 main points, conclusion.
- Engage the audience Ask a question, provocative statement, personalize with your own experience, appropriate humor and try to be creative. • Learn to use the verbal colon. " And the conclusion was this:
- The body speaks. Move with purpose; relevant facial expressions and make eye contact. · Visual aids— power point: use photos, humor, and presented charted data. · How to get ready to speak: Write it as you would speak it. Memorize the intro and conclusion, practice in front of a mirror. Give the speech to the family. Helps with transitions and vocal


