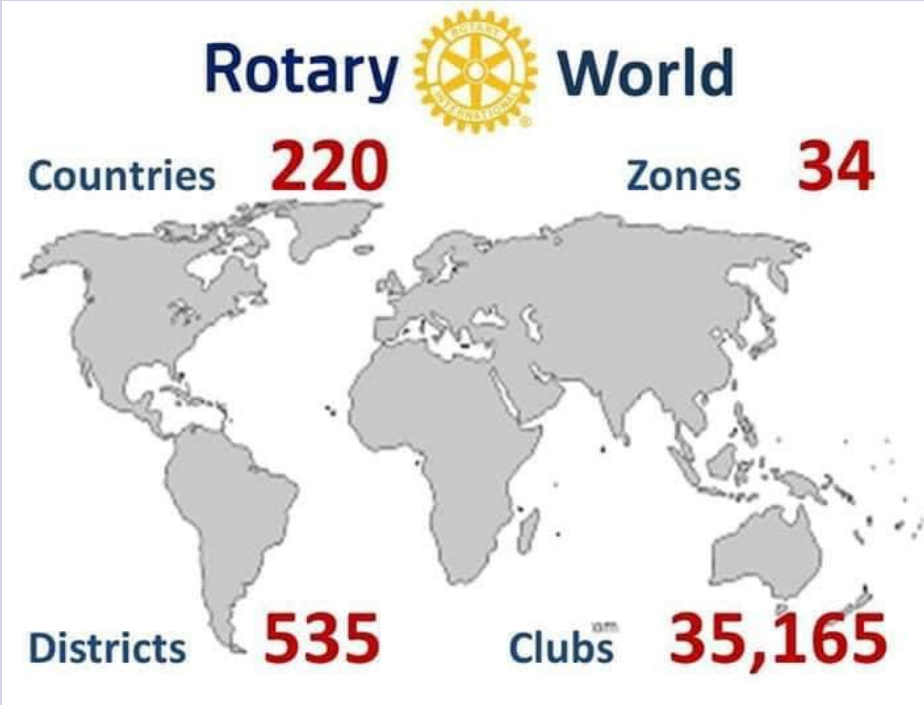
Rotary International

In the beginning ...

- ☐ The first Rotary club, Club #1, was organized in Chicago in 1905, by Paul P. Harris who was born in Racine Wisconsin.
- ☐ The club, initially had four members and met in rotation at the offices of these members – thus the name Rotary.
- ☐ The First Meeting was on the 23rd February 1905.
- ☐ There are approximately 1.2 million members in over 35,000 clubs worldwide.

Rotary International

Service Above Self

- ❑ Rotary did not take long to recognize that fellowship alone would not keep a group together - there needed to be a purpose.
- ❑ The first service project was public restrooms in downtown Chicago, IL, USA.
- ❑ Rotary thus became the world's first service club.

Rotary's Guiding Principals

- ❑ The development of *acquaintance* as an *opportunity for service*
- ❑ High *ethical* standards: *worthiness* and *dignifying* of all occupations
- ❑ *Application of the ideal of service* to personal, business, and community life
- ❑ *Advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace*
through a united fellowship

Earlyact, Interact and Rotaract



Earlyact - Is a school-wide service club for elementary students from ages 5 to 13.



Interact - brings together young people ages 12-18 to develop leadership skills while discovering the power of Service Above Self.



Rotaract - brings together people ages 18-30 to exchange ideas with leaders in the community, develop leadership and professional skills, and have fun .

Rotary International – Youth Programs

RYLA, YE, STEP

RYLA - Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) is an intensive leadership experience organized by Rotary clubs and districts where you develop your skills as a leader while having fun and making connections.

Rotary Youth Exchange - Builds peace one young person at a time. Students learn a new language, discover another culture, and truly become global citizens. Exchanges for students ages 15-19 are sponsored by Rotary clubs in more than 100 countries

STEP - The Summer Exchange Program is a short term exchange between families. The student lives with a foreign student's family for approximately one month and then both students return to Canada or the US where the foreign student lives with the student's family for another month

Rotary International - Peace Fellowships

Peace Fellowship

Peace Fellowships: Each year, Rotary awards up to 130 fully funded fellowships for dedicated leaders from around the world to study at one of our peace centers.

Master's degree programs: Accepted candidates study peace and development issues with research-informed teaching and a diverse student body. The program lasts 15 to 24 months and includes a 2-3 month field study, which participants design themselves.

Professional development certificate program: Experienced leaders gain practical tools for promoting peace and international development during an intensive, 3- month program, which includes 3 weeks of field study and peer learning opportunities with a diverse group.
