OUR CLUB LAST WEEK'S MEETING:

President **Patrick Dobbyn** presided.

Program: Ineke Boekhorst – Starfish Pack Program

Ineke Boekhorst reviewed with us the working of this program during the past year, including changes that were necessary as a result of COVID, and what we need to decide to do going forward. Originally, the backpacks were filled and then returned by the students to the school. This year during COVID a new pack (bag) was used which was kept by the students and not returned. The Burnett Fellowship Church previously picked up the food, packed the bags and delivered them to the schools. This was all stopped as a result of COVID. For a few months we issued gift cards that the families could pick up and use at Save On Foods, but it was found that this program was not workable. On some occasions the cards were used to buy cigarettes and or alcohol, and it was felt that the money was not going directly to feed the children in many cases. Effective September 2020 the club (Ineke) purchases the groceries and takes them to the Food Bank, who provided us with temporary space to pack and deliver the bags. 6 to 8 Members of our club pack the bags every week and deliver them to the schools.



What's in a pack?

- 2 breakfasts, 2 lunches, 2 dinners, 2 snacks and 2 pieces of fresh fruit – more than enough to cover the weekend.
- We offer 4 different menus for “regular weeks” + 2 different “holiday menus” for long weekends(or school breaks)

The cost works out to \$575 per student per year. Each pack for a regular menu cost \$14, but \$20 for a holiday menu.

A discussion followed, about our options for the future. Should we continue to do it ourselves, or get another community group to do it and bear the cost, or have another community group handle it and we just pay the cost? The general consensus was that it is a most valuable program and our club should make sure that it continues to serve our communities. Having the use of a pickup truck to collect the food would be of great assistance. Ineke is going to contact the Burnett fellowship church to see if they still wish to be involved, and to what extent they are able to do so, and report back to us.

Which schools are participating?

- Presently 11 elementary schools in Maple Ridge + 4 elementary schools in Pitt Meadows
- Adding 4 highschools in September 2021

The cost of the food for each pack was \$14. Once the packs are delivered to the school it is not up to us to determine who receives them. Rather, it is the principal or healthcare worker in the school. The number of packs required by each school sometimes varies and is adjusted weekly.

How much funding is required annually?

- Depends on how many kids we serve ea. week
- 4445 Starfish Packs distributed 2020/2021 schoolyear
- Approx. annual budget for 2021/2022 schoolyear is **\$70,000.00**

How are Starfish Packs funded?

- Online donations through “Canada Helps” – www.Starfishpack.com
- Local residents – (some made a monthly commitment)
- Local businesses and offices
- Community fundraising activities
