President Patrick Dobbyn presided.

(Via Zoom) Leslee Lucy - a member of the Merritt Rotary Club



Leslee Lucy spoke to us briefly about the flood situation in her town of Merritt.

The population of the town itself is about 7,000 people, with about 15,000 people living in the taxing area. Approximate 100 Homes in Merritt were completely destroyed and about 100 were damaged but repairable. The hospital in Merritt was not

damaged by the flood but because of lack of services had to be evacuated. When services are back, then the hospital will open up again.

Some residents (including Leslee and all other members of the Merritt Rotary club) were fortunate enough to be living in areas around Merritt that were not affected by the flood. Some homes in the flood area are now okay and residents are able to return. Some homes that were damaged are in need of repair, but once that is accomplished then they will be able to return (this is the group where the current need is most urgent). And some of the homes were completely destroyed.

The Merritt Rotary club is setting up a separate bank account to collect donations with the money being used as the Club sees fit depending on the needs in the community. When that bank account is set up, we will be notified in the event that we wish to send money. They will also work with an outfit called Samaritan's Purse which is coming to help in the community.

[Their website says: Samaritan's Purse mobilizes specialized staff and equipment as well as hundreds of volunteers when natural disasters occur on Canadian soil. We provide emergency aid and help with cleanup in the wake of severe wildfires, floods, hurricanes, tornados, and more.]

Happy and Sad Dollars and other news:

Ineke: The fundraiser held last weekend at FreshCo (where we buy the food for the Starfish program) raised approximately \$1,150 which was shared equally with the Food Bank and the Starfish program. In addition, a lot of food was donated



(about half a truck full); and one Rotarian donated enough money for two backpacks, and the Casino donated \$750.
