LAST WEEK'S MEETING

Topics: **Friends in Need Food Bank** ("FINFB") - **Mary Robson**



The FINFB is an affiliated member of Food Banks BC and Food Banks Canada which keep FINFB informed of the changes in need across the country. The numbers of re-registrations and new registrations have been on the increase this year which can be attributed to the cost of living and rate of inflation. FINFB has seen a significant growth in new families who have immigrated to Canada and have chosen Maple

Ridge/Pitt Meadows as their new home. As an example, 44 Ukrainian families have chosen our community in their resettlement. The client base of FINFB is 30% seniors and 27% children under the age of 18.

Not only does the FINFB prepare hampers of non-perishable food staples which are given out each month, but its clients can also attend once a week to receive perishables which include produce, dairy, meat, etc. and which may include household items and personal care items. The perishable product comes from its **Perishable Food Recovery Program**, which is now picking up from 7 of the 8 Major Grocery Stores in Maple Ridge and Pitt Meadows. This program not only diverts food from landfills, but also results in savings of CO2 emissions. Non-perishable products that are not given out to clients of the food bank are given as farm feed to local farmers which also reduces the amount going to compost, and farmers love the fresh farm feed.

Another program of FINFB is the **School Meal Snack Program** which provides food to almost every school in School District 42. The schools place weekly orders with the food bank which delivers the orders at the beginning of each week. Each school determines what their need is and what type of meal programs they provide to students in need. There are more than 3,000 students benefiting from this program on a weekly basis. (A grant from Breakfast Club of Canada in the amount of \$119,000 fully funded this program for the 2022/2023 school year.)



The FINFB's **Thanksgiving Food Drive** will be held on September 24, 2022. In 2021 a total of 16,975 pounds of food was collected. Since 2011, this food drive has collected more than 100,000 pounds of food. This annual event, which was started in 2008 by members of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, supports local food banks across the Lower Mainland, including our FINFB.

Maple Ridge Language School - Ksenia Belyaeva



Ksenia is a Ukrainian refugee who recently moved to Maple Ridge. She is a professor from the Kharkiv University in Ukraine and an ESL teacher. She is the principal of the Maple Ridge Language School which is offering English language lessons to Ukrainian refugees, with Golden Ears United Church providing the location for the classes. Volunteers are needed to babysit the children while their mothers attend the classes. Most of the refugees are women and children, as the husbands and fathers were required to stay and help fight the Russian invasion. When the program was started two months ago there were 4 attendees, and now there are 27 persons attending the classes. The school is looking for monetary donations to help fund the program.

Bill started to suspect that Larry was not the experienced hunter he claimed to be.

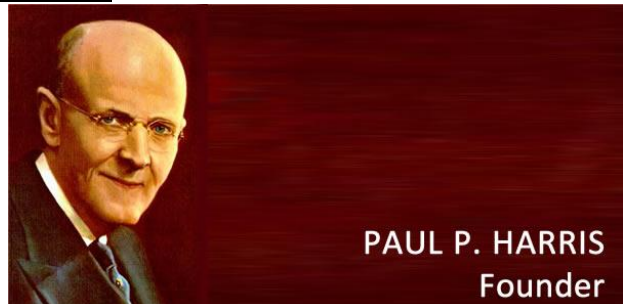
Lynda: let it be known that Mary Robson has become a grandmother again with the arrival of a new baby to Gordon Jr. and his wife.
