Ineke was happy that she, with daughter Marjolein, Libby, Debbie and Laurie attended the District Foundation Dinner which was held on November 16, 2022. An inspiring talk was given by filmmaker Alison MacLean, a Rotary Peace Scholarship Alumni, who recounted her work in Afghanistan.

The former South Surrey resident was in Afghanistan for four separate media embeds with the forces of six NATO countries during the past decade – putting herself in serious risk, much of it feature-length documentary for her passion project Burkas2Bullets, celebrating the Afghan women who chose to become part of the police and the military in the fight against Taliban and ISIS-K forces. Since the democratic government was ousted by the Taliban, the plight of anyone who worked with Western humanitarian organizations, journalists or military personnel over the past 20 years - particularly women and children - has become dire, MacLean said. She is now doing everything she can to find safe passage for Afghans fleeing their homeland.

Laurie was happy to have "happy birthday" sung to him on his 80th birthday, happy that at least he is not as old as President Joe Biden, and happy that his children haven't taken away his car keys - but not so happy to remember that on his 21st birthday John F. Kennedy was assassinated.
