Speaker: Nicole MacDonald, Mayor of Pitt Meadows



<u>About Our Speaker</u>

Nicole MacDonald was elected mayor by acclamation during the last election in October 2022. She is only the second female Mayor ever to have served in the city of Pitt Meadows (the other one being Deb Walters who was elected in 2011, and served for only one term. Nicole served as a Councillor for the city of Pitt Meadows for the past four years, as one of five Councillors. The four remaining

incumbent Councillors were also re-elected. Nicole has two "wonderful daughters" and is married to her husband Garett. She and her family have lived in Pitt Meadows for 16 years. She obtained her Masters Degree in Applied Legal Studies from Simon Fraser University, and then opened and operated her notary practice in Pitt Meadows where she still serves as a Notary Public. Prior to becoming a Notary Public, Nicole was a Police Officer with the Vancouver Police Department for eight years. As a Pitt Meadows Councillor, she represented the city on numerous committees, including Police Liaison, Agricultural Advisory, Economic Development Advisory, YPK Airport Board of Directors, 911 EComm Board of Directors and Metro Vancouver Indigenous Relations Committee.

Her Presentation

Nicole MacDonald said that she and her fellow Councillors have several priorities. Probably at the top of the list is public safety, so that the City will be prepared for emergencies and first response situations. Pitt Meadows is the only city in the lower mainland the does not currently have a full-time fire department, and has operated on an on-call basis. With the new fire department being constructed, the city will soon have a full-time fire department.

Another priority is autonomous policing. The plan is to have its own RCMP detachment within the City.

A third priority is improved infrastructure which will better serve not only the present, but also the future. A major, frustrating problem is the traffic congestion caused by the CPR railroad track which runs across the main roads in and out of downtown Pitt Meadows. Pitt Meadows has two of the busiest rail crossings in the Lower Mainland. The tracks are not only an inconvenience (it is estimated that the trains currently block the Harris Road tracks approximately four hours each day, and with increasing trade volumes, train traffic in Pitt Meadows is forecast to double over the next 10 years) but also a safety hazard in closing off access to first responders, such as the fire department and police. For many years the City has been working on an underpass or overpass without much progress, but Nicole is confident that they are now very close to making a deal with not only CPR but also the other levels of government. The Kennedy Road overpass is also being planned, and the City's share of the cost is estimated to be about \$110,000,000.

The fact that prior Councils allowed commercial development so close to the residential area and thereby limited the ability of the city to properly develop its riverfront to its full potential, while at the same time failing to guarantee a reasonable tax return from the commercial property, is in Nicole's view regrettable. Tax revenue for the city is divided roughly 50/50 between commercial and residential properties.

Happy and Said Dollars included:
