Program: **Rebecca Arthur** - Short Term Rotary Exchange to France – Zoomed in to us from South Africa

**Rebecca** is the daughter of Adrienne's cousin who spoke to us about her exchange trip to France, which took place between November 21, 2022 to January 25, 2023. Rebecca together with fellow student Claire Greene (both 17 years old) are members of the Fourways Main Reef Rotary Club's youth group.



When in France, they stayed with different foster families, and got to sightsee, attend school and attend Rotary events. Rebecca said that she had an amazing experience and was grateful for the opportunity. She found the school system in France to be very different from that in South Africa where she was used to starting school at 7:45 AM and was out by 2:30 PM. In France, on the other hand, school was "incredibly long" and lasted from 8 AM to 5 PM. She did not learn how to speak French before leaving on her trip, and therefore found that what she could learn while attending school in France, somewhat limited. She enjoyed meeting exchange students from Spain.

She saw many exciting places and things.

She went to the Notre Dame-de-la-Treille Cathedral in the city of Lille, which is an example of Gothic Revival architecture and is considered a national monument.





She went to a Night at the Opera, visited Euro Disneyland, and had a few "cultural food shocks" of French Haute Cuisine, including, for the first ("and last time"!!) in her life munching on a land snail, aka escargot.

While not on the "haute cuisine" menu, she found that "Cheese and Crisps" always made it to the party in France (but Rebecca said she doesn't each much cheese at home in South Africa, so it sounded like she was not too impressed with this *aperitif*).

In addition to eating snails, another thing she experienced for the first time in her life was snow. She went snowshoeing up the mountains in the beautiful village of Samoen, and stayed in a great hotel. She said "I have no words for the great view".

Down at sea level again, another highlight of her trip was Cannes, and visiting the aquarium in Monaco, and the town of Grasse on the French Riviera (in the hills north of Cannes) known for its longestablished perfume industry.

Back in Paris, she travelled to the second floor of the Eiffel Tower (where the view of the city is best seen).



Rebecca summed it up by saying that on the trip she "felt luxurious". "It was an absolutely insane and amazing experience" where she "learned about different cultures", and was able to tell those that she met in France about "what it is like in South Africa". Also, "speaking to other exchange students was amazing".

When asked what advice she would give to other young people considering a student exchange, she said, "Be open to anything - if people offer to take you somewhere or to try eating something, do it" – "Approach everything with an open mind".

Rebecca concluded by singing a song to us which, in spite of the less-than-ideal Zoom sound connection, showed what a great talent she has.
